PROJECT OVERVIEW

The PICTURES project is focused on fostering new, multidisciplinary approaches to teaching and learning in correctional settings, with a particular emphasis on pedagogy for emerging adults. We're developing unique teaching methods, creating digital learning environments, and establishing Correctional Pedagogy HUBS across Europe. Our goal is to equip practitioners with the tools they need to deliver high-quality interventions, while facilitating collaboration between educators, employers, and civil society stakeholders.

We aim to build a comprehensive framework for enhancing correctional education through our carefully designed phases for the three years from 01.02.2024 till 31.01.2027. In the Framing Phase -(FRAME THE PICTURES), we are laying the groundwork understanding correctional ecosystem. As we move into the Phase Elevating (LEVEL PICTURES), we focus on raising the standards training professionalisation.

PROJECT UPDATES

Since the launch of the PICTURES project, we've been hard at work implementing key activities as part of our overarching objective to FRAME THE PICTURES—developing a comprehensive understanding of the correctional ecosystem and preparing the ground for future developments:

- Local Events: We organized local events in 10 countries to disseminate the project's initiatives on a national level. These events aimed to build a positive environment for stakeholder participation in upcoming activities, including interviews, additional DACUM workshops, and training.
- Ecosystem Mapping and Stakeholder Engagement: A key focus has been identifying and engaging the diverse stakeholders involved in correctional pedagogy-employers, vocational education and training (VET) providers, higher education (HE) institutions, and civil society. We conducted a needs assessment to identify the skills and knowledge required by correctional practitioners, aiming to improve training and professionalization across the sector.
- **DACUM Workshops**: Held across 10 partner countries, these workshops helped identify the core tasks, skills, and competencies needed for those working with emerging adults in correctional systems. The findings will guide the development of competency-based curricula and upskilling programs tailored to these unique needs.
- National Reports: Extensive research has been completed, resulting in national reports that compile findings from various methods, such as interviews, stakeholder mapping, and policy analysis. These reports, available in both maternal and English languages, are fed into a synthesis report that lays the foundation for the standardization of correctional pedagogy across Europe.

- Update of Justice Sectoral Occupational Profiles: We'll be identifying and updating occupational profiles for emerging adults within the justice sector.
- Stakeholder Webinar: Findings will be validated through a webinar with key stakeholders.
- Adaptation at the Country Level: Occupational profiles will be adapted to fit specific country contexts.
- PICTURES Ecosystem Modeling: We'll model the ecosystem according to environmental, social, and governance factors.
- Chart of PICTURES Competences: A comprehensive chart of competencies will be developed.
- Correctional Pedagogy Strategy: We'll deliver a strategic document outlining future directions for correctional pedagogy.
